Louis IX: King of France

(1) King Louis IX (Louis the ninth) was the king of France from 1226 to 1270. He was born in 1214 in modern-day Tunisia. Louis became King Louis IX in 1226 when he was only 12 years old. As a young king, he needed some help ruling. His mother, Blanche of Castile, made important decisions on his behalf. Over time, King Louis IX grew into an effective and very popular monarch.

Battling England

(2) King Louis IX was a talented knight and led several successful battles. He led his first battle in 1229, at the age of 15. It ended peacefully with Henry III of Brittany withdrawing his troops. In 1242, King Louis IX commanded another battle and successfully pushed the English back once again. Then, in 1258, he established a new peace with the Treaty of Paris.

(3) However, other battles proved to be less successful. There were also defeats.

The Crusades

(4) King Louis IX ruled during a time when religion played an important role. Two of those religions were Christianity and Islam. Rulers wanted to spread their religious ideas into the lands they claimed. This contributed to the Crusades, a series of battles between Christians and Muslims. Christians followed Christianity. Muslims followed Islam.

(5) Around 1244, the city of Jerusalem was under Muslim control, and it was closed to Jewish and Christian pilgrims. People had witnessed Jerusalem go back and forth between Christian and Muslim control for 200 years, so few supported another crusade. However, Louis IX wanted Jerusalem to be under Christian rule, so that Christians could once again visit the city. So, in 1248, he left for the crusade with 100 ships and 35,000 soldiers. This crusade was known as the Seventh Crusade. It lasted from 1248 to 1254.

(6) In 1249, King Louis IX and his forces landed in Egypt, a country within the Muslim empire. After one victorious takeover of a city, the flooded Nile waters kept him from pushing his men forward until the next year. Eventually, King Louis IX's forces made advancements. However, the plague spread throughout his forces. With his men sick and exhausted, the Egyptians captured them in the spring of 1250. Though he was defeated, King Louis IX used his time in captivity to make agreements and diplomatic friendships to strengthen Christian cities in Egypt. He continued this work even when he was set free.

(7) In his later years, King Louis IX was preoccupied with Jerusalem again. He believed it was important for all pilgrims to be able to visit the holy city. He went on another crusade at great risk to his health and died in 1270. He left his kingdom to his son Philip. His people deeply felt his loss and promised to never forget him.
